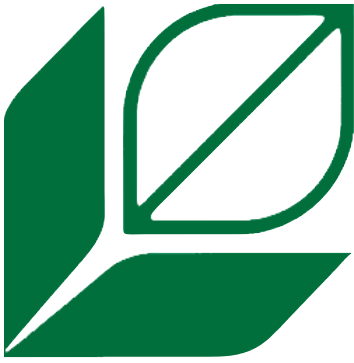

<b>PAPER BIRCH</b> ( <i>Betula papyrifera</i> ) Most ornamental of the native Birches. Bark is usually smooth chalk white and peels in papery layers, golden fall color. Also known as Canoe Birch.	5.00	45.00	10

<b>PORT ORFORD CEDAR</b> ( <i>Chamaecyparis lawsoniana</i> ) Densely pyramidal with soft graceful bluish green foliage. Can be planted closely and sheared into a hedge. Important species for commercial timber in coastal Oregon.	3.00	10.00	5
<b>HINOKI JAPANESE FALSE CYPRESS</b> ( <i>Chamaecyparis obtusa</i> ) Slow growing evergreen tree native to Japan. Excellent landscape specimen with dark green foliage.	3.00	25.00	10
<b>JAPANESE RED CEDAR</b> ( <i>Cryptomeria japonica</i> ) Coneal tree with wide spreading branches. Reddish brown bark peeling off in long shreds. Fast growing when young (3-4' per year). Young foliage soft bright bluish green.	4.00	20.00	5
<b>COMMON JUNIPER</b> ( <i>Juniperus communis</i> ) Densely branched shrub to small tree. Adapted to poor, rocky soils. Very drought tolerant, best in full sun.	2.00	15.00	10

<b>FORSYTHIA VARIETIES</b> (Forsythia var.) Early spring flowers appear before foliage. Hedging, borders, specimens. Meadowlark - upright arching habit, cold tolerant. <b>CREEPING WINTERGREEN</b> (Gaultheria procumbens) Low growing, evergreen groundcover best suited for moist, partially shaded soils.	2.00	15.00	10
<b>SALAL</b> (Gaultheria shallon) Evergreen bright foliage, pink bell-shaped flowers on reddish stalks. Grows tallest in partial shade on good soils, stays low in direct sun. Also known as "Lemonleaf".	2.00	15.00	10
<b>CAROLINA SILVERBELL</b> (Halesia tetraaptera) 25 Low branched tree or large shrub. White bell-shaped blooms and unique seed pods form a great accent in the garden. Moderate growth rate.	4.00	75.00	10
<b>CHINESE WITCHHAZEL</b> (Hamamelis mollis) Best of the Witch Hazels for landscaping. Aromatic, bright yellow flowers before foliage. Golden-yellow in fall.	3.00	60.00	50
<b>VERNAL WITCH HAZEL</b> (Hamamelis vernalis) Upright, spreading, suckering shrub spreads rapidly by roots giving excellent streambank erosion control. Unusual because of small yellow-red fragrant flowers in very early spring.	4.00	35.00	10
<b>HYDRANGEA VARIETIES</b> (Hydrangea paniculata var.) Chantilly™ - very large, cone shaped, lacy white summer blooms age to deep pink. Compacta - double white flowers, better suited for small landscapes. Kyushu - large lacy white flower heads, July through September. <b>WINTERBERRY HOLLY</b> (Ilex verticillata) Upright shrub, ½" red fruit in late summer hangs on well into winter. Useful in wetland restoration, landscaping and wildlife habitat.	10.00		5
<b>BEAUTY BUSH</b> (Kolkwitzia amabilis) One of the most popular shrubs. Graceful arching branches covered in clusters of pale pink June flowers, red autumn leaf color. Likes sun but will withstand partial shade.	6.00	55.00	10
<b>SCOTCH LABURNUM</b> (Laburnum alpinum) Large shrub. Yellow flower racemes up to 16" long in mid-May.	7.00	30.00	5
<b>TWINBERRY</b> (Lonicera involucrata) Shrubby bush honeysuckle, yellow tinged red spring blooms, lustrous purple-black fruit. Sun to partial shade.	4.00	35.00	10
<b>OREGON HOLLY GRAPE</b> (Mahonia aquifolium) Evergreen, erect shrub. Glossy green leaves, reddish in winter. Yellow spring blooms followed by blue berries. Sun to partial shade.	4.00	35.00	10

<b>POTENTILLA VARIETIES</b> (Potentilla fruticosa var.) Low growing vigorous shrub. Drought tolerant. Abbotswood - pure white flowers. Dakota Goldrush® - deep golden blooms late spring until frost. Cuthbert Grant - semi-double dark red velvety flowers, fragrant. DayDream™ - fuchsia pink blooms. Henry Kelsey™ - medium red climber, 2-3" flowers. John Cabot™ - 2½" double blooms with color range of purple, pink, red. John Franklin™ - medium red double fragrant flowers. Recurrent bloomer. John Davis™ - medium pink 3½" blooms. <b>PURPLE OSIER WILLOW</b> (Salix purpurea 'Streamco') Excellent for streambank protection, tolerates wet conditions, rapid growth. Shrubby, multi-stem habit.	2.00	75.00	50
<b>BLUE ELDERBERRY</b> (Sambucus caerulea) Clusters of blue-black berries often used in jams, jellies, pies and wine if the birds don't get them first. Small, creamy-white flowers.	4.00	35.00	10
<b>AMERICAN ELDERBERRY</b> (Sambucus canadensis) Large suckering shrub. Preferred species for wildlife habitat, shelter belts in moist woodland areas, adaptable to a wide range of soil conditions. Fruit used in jams, jellies and wine.	4.00	35.00	10
<b>EUROPEAN RED ELDERBERRY</b> (Sambucus racemosa) European cousin to our native elderberry but with red fruit and yellow-white blooms. Very ornamental in mass plantings.	3.00	25.00	10
<b>DOUGLAS SPIRAEA</b> (Spiraea douglasii) Fast growing, 4-5' deciduous native shrub. Rose flowers in lovely clusters emerge June-Sept. Very adaptable - sun to part shade, very moist or dry conditions.	1.00	10.00	10
